

Student Appointed Professor Application Form

Do you feel that certain areas at New College are under-represented?

The Student Appointed Professor (SAP) is a semester-long adjunct professorship position, funded by the Council of Academic Affairs, created so that students have the opportunity to recruit professors that have expertise in a niche not normally available at New College.

Some past areas that have had SAP are languages, arts, religion, and ecology. All areas of study are open as long as there is no current professor who teaches that course as part of his or her area of specialty.

How does a student find a Student Appointed Professor to nominate?

How is the SAP Selected?

A Student Appointed Professor must have a Ph.D. or some form of a terminal degree in their field of study, which adheres to the guidelines outlined in the faculty handbook for hiring adjunct professors. Final selection will be based on the strength of the proposal if all requirements (listed below) are met. No single division can have more than one SAP two semesters in a row unless no other divisions submit an application. The current SAP (Spring 2006) is in Natural Sciences.

What are the requirements for nominating a SAP candidate?

In order to submit an application for SAP, each student should turn in a packet with this letter to the VPAA mailbox by the announced date containing the following items:

- Applicant's Curriculum Vitae
- Proposed course syllabus, including class size limits
- Letter of Intent
- Letter of NC student support
- Letter of NC faculty support, from the division under which the adjunct and his/her class would fit
